This Sunday's Readings

1ST READING: Acts 2: 1-11

RESPONSORIAL: Ps 104:1, 24, 29-31, 34

2ND READING: Galatians 5:16-25

GOSPEL: John 20: 19-23



The following is transcribed from Bishop Robert Barron's Podcast: "[Walking According to The Spirit](#) "

Reflecting on the 2nd reading for Pentecost this year, in the 5th chapter in his letter to the Galatians, St. Paul tells the Church which at that time was a very primitive Christian community, that the Spirit is at war with the flesh. Let us be careful that we don't fall into a dualist or puritanical reading of Paul's words. He does not mean that non-material reality is good, material reality is bad because that is simply not the way a Jew in Paul's day would think. So what does he mean here? It becomes imminently clear that when Paul lays out the works of the flesh, he is referring to sin and the path of sin. And the works of the Spirit have to do with love. So it is really sin vs love he's talking about. Not flesh vs spirit in the platonic way.

In verses 19 and 20, Paul lists out the works of the flesh as "*immorality, impurity, lust, idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions, drinking bouts, orgies, and the like*". It is important to note that sexual sin is an important category in the Bible. It is equally important that we not overstate the importance of sexual sin (i.e. when we think of 'sin' only sexual sin comes to mind) – that too is a distortion. But Paul identifies in this list: immorality, impurity, lust...orgies.. Because our sexual lives can become disordered precisely in the measure that they move outside the ambit of love and becomes mere means to pleasure. That's the biblical sense. If the works of the flesh are opposed to the path of love, what he is saying is that your sexual life can become opposed to love if it is simply the means to pleasure. For example, the deadly sin of lust is defined by Thomas Aquinas and many others as "taking of inordinate amounts of pleasure in sex". That is what lust is: using another person simply as a means to the end of acquiring pleasure for oneself. It is inordinate – it is disordered use of sexuality. Do any of us need to be reminded of the prevalence of pornography in our society? How about the problem of human trafficking?

Now look at the emphasis Paul places on acts and attitudes that divide us. **Where there is division there is sin.** Paul lists them: hatreds, rivalry, jealousy, acts of selfishness, dissensions, factions... On this Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate the Holy Spirit, let us take a good hard look at this reality in our lives. When Spirit came upon the apostles what did it do? It brought them together. And then as they preached in the various languages of the world, it brought the whole world together as one. That is the Spirit drawing us together. So the question to each one of us is this: where has divisions, hatreds and rivalries come to dominate you? To what degree is your psychological and spiritual energy been given over to cultivating or brooding about rivalries, divisions and

hatreds; over people you are not crazy about, people who you feel have slighted you? Are there some people in your life you have not been able to forgive? That's the work of the flesh.

Paul then contrasts these to the works of the Spirit. He tells us what the signs are that the Holy Spirit is in you. Notice the first fruit of the Spirit is **LOVE** ~ *agape* ~ **because from agape flows all the other. Love is the great enduring sign of the Holy Spirit.** The kind of love Paul is talking about is *to will the good of the other*. Is that kind of love operating in you? Do you feel this desire for the good of the other?

From love flows *joy*, which is the one common pursuit of every single person on the face of the earth, Christian and non-Christian alike. We all want to be happy, but true happiness does not have anything to do with superficial pleasure that comes and goes, but rather, it has to do with that sense of **connection which is tantamount to love.** Love and joy are linked together.

What are the other consequences of love besides joy? *Patience*. Why do we become impatient with others? Usually because they are not doing things our way; they are not moving fast enough toward the goal that we want. But if we are really willing the good of the other, if my life isn't about me, but you, then I am patient with the pace that you are keeping.

Next Paul mentions *kindness* ~ this is simple and concrete. Love (willing the good of the other) incarnates itself in the simple acts of kindness, like saying hello, inquiring how someone is doing and actually really meaning it, holding a door, writing a thank you note. Is it possible to 'act kind' when you are not walking in the Spirit? Yes of course.. but that is why Paul says "fruit of the Spirit" rather than fruits. Because from the first fruit: love, flows the rest.

The last fruit of the spirit that Paul sites is **self-control**. Those of lack self-control, those who fly off the handle, those who indulge in outbursts of temper, they are not focused on the good of those around them. They are preoccupied with their own feelings, their own needs and frustrations. But if your focus is truly on the good of the other, then you will master your own thoughts and feelings and reactions, always putting them in the service of the other.

Paul concludes "*those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live in the Spirit, let us also follow the Spirit.*" (v. 24-25) All of us baptised and confirmed and therefore received the gift of the Holy Spirit: here are our marching orders! **Nail to the Cross all that is not of love in you. Uncover all those passions, thoughts, desires, attitudes that are opposed to love and crucify them! Put them to death and then walk in the way of the Spirit which means willing the good of the other, even in the simplest way. There you will find the joy that you seek.**

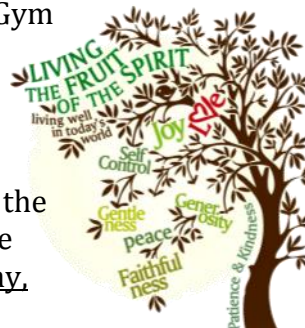
