Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Next Sunday is Pro-Life Sunday in the Archdiocese of Vancouver and so there will be the annual 2nd collection in support of the pro-life organizations and groups that serve in our Archdiocese. Last year's collection totaled \$178,543 which was portioned out to crises pregnancy centres including Birthright, anti-euthanasia projects including a national hot-line, the March for Life, University groups, post-abortion healing and political activism, 22 grant applications in all. We have special envelopes available, and all donations are counted and receipted through the parish office, and forwarded to the Chancery Office for disbursement. Thank you for your generosity in this very worthy cause in support of life.

Since Easter Sunday the Church has celebrated the Easter Season Sundays, six in all, and then four more solemn Sundays, ie the Ascension, Pentecost, Holy Trinity, and Corpus Christi. All of them high feasts in the Church's liturgical calendar. Now this week we move into the ordinary time of the year for the next many months until the end of November. The liturgical color is green, the color of hope, and it serves as a reminder that the Resurrection of Christ gives us hope in our lives, especially in the face of the great struggles we have when we have to deal with suffering and death. So we walk in hope, as the "ordinary" way for all who believe and follow Christ.

I'm thankful for all who have made their gift to Project Advance over these past few weeks since we launched the Appeal. If your pledge card is still on your desk can you pull it forward and fill it in, otherwise the summer will be upon us and it could get forgotten in the business of holiday and recreation plans. See in the bulletin for an update.

This Sunday's Mass Readings

1ST READING: Genesis 3: 9-15
RESPONSORIAL: Psalm 130:1-8
2ND READING: 2 Cor 4:13 - 5:1
GOSPEL: Mark 3: 20-35

In today's Gospel Jesus has just been healing and casting out demons in Galilee. Along with the crowds, who flock to Him so that He "*could not even have a meal*" (Mark 3:20), come people who do not understand what He is doing. Even His friends think He has lost His mind (v.21) and needs to be taken away for a while. But the scribes who came down from Jerusalem are not just honestly mistaken; they accuse Him of being possessed by the prince of demons.

The reality is just the opposite. Jesus is revealing Himself as the one promised in our First Reading. He is the seed of the woman who has come to crush the head of the demonic serpent (Gen 3: 15). The scribes blaspheme by attributing this work of the Holy Spirit to demons. Jesus adds a statement that shocks us at first: "*whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness.*" (Mark 3:29) That does not mean that there are any limits to the mercy of God (CCC1864). Rather, the only sin that cannot be forgiven is the deliberate refusal to accept His mercy offered through the Holy Spirit.

Instead, we must imitate those who sat at Jesus' feet. For, as He said, "*Whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister, and mother.*" (Mark 3:35). So, what then did Jesus tell His disciples is **His will** for them?

They should show love. Based on what Jesus tells His disciples in Matthew and in John, they are to love God with everything they are. They are to love their neighbors as themselves. They are even to love their enemies. Then through the way they show love to one another, everyone will know they truly are the disciples of Jesus. This is truly impossible unless we have a firm understanding (in our heads and our hearts) that **God loved us this way first**. We were all enemies of God, and *while we were enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son* (Romans 5:9). Jesus showed His love for us by freely giving up His position as a son, so we could be adopted as a son or a daughter. He was separated from the loving relationship He had with the Father so we wouldn't have to. So Jesus' family does the will of God by showing love.

They do the will of God by making more disciples. In Matthew 28 after Jesus' resurrection, as He was preparing to ascend into heaven, He gets ready to pass on His mission. His disciples were there. What once was His mission will now be carried out by His disciples - bring new people into the family of God, and not just people from the same city, but people from all over the world. It was always Jesus' intention that His family would grow to include every ethnic group in the world. When we are adopted into God's family, His mission to make more disciples becomes our mission. St. Augustine said, "*Since you cannot do good to all, you are to pay special attention to those who, by the accidents of time, or place, or circumstances, are brought into closer connection with you.*"

Please make an appointment with one of our priests to discuss having your marriage convalidated, or "blessed".

Growing a *Culture of Life*

Watching the news and reading the headlines, we may feel outraged yet somewhat helpless seeing the heartbreaking lack of respect for human life. How do we respond when our efforts seem small in the face of the culture of death?

To understand more fully how to defend and protect human life, we must first consider who we are, at the deepest level. God creates us in his image and likeness, which means we are made to be in loving relationship with him. His love is individual, real and unchanging and is the essence of our identity and worth, the source of our dignity. It is really not a question of who we are, but rather *whose* we are. Because His love will never change, nothing can reduce our God-given dignity, and nothing can diminish the immeasurable worth of our lives.

If we truly believe that all human beings are created by God in his image, then what it means to be

pro-life is way bigger than just pro-unborn babies. The unborn are the most vulnerable yes, but what it means to be pro-life is to take a position of compassion and kindness toward the sick, the poor, the homeless, the aged, the mentally challenged, the inmate, the refugee. Being pro-life is being pro-humankind, not only caring for the unborn.

Our pro-life position is to be rooted in the Word of God and in God's good design for humankind, rather than rooted in political ideologies. Are we to enter into the political arena? Absolutely, but our strongest and most powerful voice as believers will be in the arena of sharing Christ's love. Because what we're asking God to do in that arena is to increase our love. We want to love people in a way that mirrors the way Jesus loved people. We want to show kindness the way Jesus showed kindness.

When we encounter someone facing a great trial, or someone lonely, elderly, sick, "the least of these", we need to meet them where they are, walk alongside, intercede for them, and be open to sharing Christ's love however He directs. This is what it means to grow in our capacity to love. This has everything to do with Good News to the poor, which is what Christ came to preach.

There are so many opportunities for us to give time and money (see article on ProLife Sunday collection). This is how the Church is to meet head-on the "culture of death" in our day: by *picking up chins* and looking into tear-filled eyes and saying, "neither do I condemn you." (John 8:11)

We want to re-vitalize our pro-life ministry here at Star of the Sea Parish, beginning by calling it the
