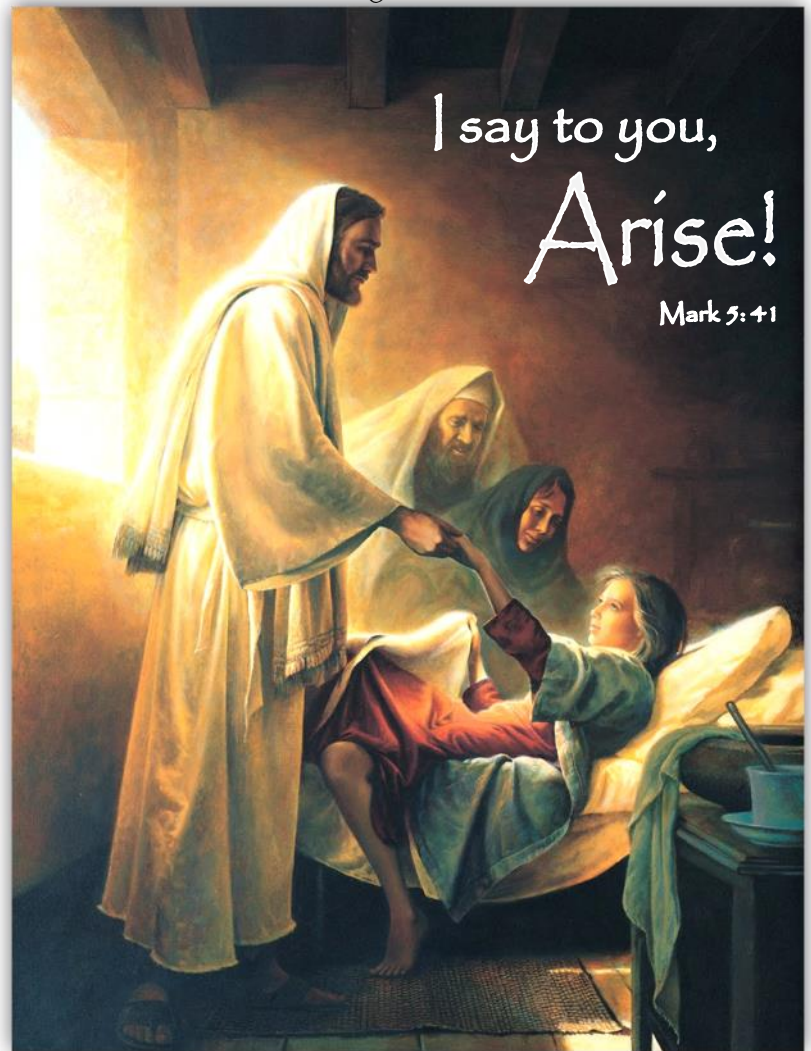

## This Sunday's Mass Readings

**1ST READING:** Wisdom 1: 13-15, 2: 23-34

**RESPONSORIAL:** Psalm 30: 2, 4-6, 11-13

**2ND READING:** 2 Cor 8: 7, 9, 13-15

**GOSPEL:** Mark 5: 21-24, 35-43

We hear in today's First Reading that God, who formed us in His imperishable image, did not intend for us to die. Death entered the world through the devil's envy and Adam and Eve's sin. *"Because God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living... for God created man for incorruption, and made him in the image of his own eternity, but through the devil's envy death entered the world"* (Wisdom 1:13...2:23-24)

But in the moving story in today's Gospel, we see Jesus liberate a little girl from the possession of death. On one level, Mark is recounting an event that led the disciples to understand Jesus' authority and power over even the final enemy, death. On another level, however, this episode is written to strengthen our hope that we too will be raised from the dead. *"I am the Resurrection. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies, he will live."* (John 11:25-26).

On reflecting on this same Gospel passage of Jesus raising Jairus' daughter, Pope Francis highlighted how Jesus looks at every human being: "He is close to the people", the Pope said, "he is always surrounded by crowds, but he didn't walk around with guards to protect him, so that the people could not touch him. No, no! He stayed there and people surrounded him. And there were more people around every time Jesus went out. Jesus always surrounds himself with people but not in order to become popular. It is not popularity that interests Him, but the wellbeing of souls. He sought people, and the people sought him. The people had their gaze fixed on him and he had his fixed on them. This is the peculiarity of Jesus' gaze: He does not standardize people; He looks at each person."

Just before He raises Jairus' daughter, Mark describes Jesus healing a woman suffering from haemorrhaging for 12 years who, though pressed by the crowd, was able to touch his cloak, and he realizes that he was touched. For "the gaze of Jesus falls on both the big and the small. That's how **Jesus sees us all: He sees all things, but looks at each of us. He sees our big problems, our greatest joys, and also looks at the little things about us. Because he is close. Jesus is not afraid of the big things, but also takes account of the small ones. That's how Jesus looks at us.**"

Pope Francis continues, "If we run with perseverance, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, we will be completely astonished, just as happened to the people after the raising of Jairus' daughter."



"I go forward, looking at Jesus. I walk ahead, keeping my gaze fixed on Jesus, and what do I find? That he has his gaze fixed on me! And that makes me feel this great astonishment. This is the astonishment of the encounter with Jesus. But let us not be afraid! We are not afraid, just as that woman was not afraid to touch Jesus' mantle. Let us not be afraid! Let us run down this road with our gaze ever fixed on Jesus. And we will have a beautiful surprise: He will fill us with awe. Jesus himself has his gaze fixed on me!"

Pope Francis also highlighted that "when Jesus heals, he never leaves him alone... He is not a magician, warlock, or a healer who goes and heals and then continues on his way. Rather, he returns everyone to the proper place. He does not leave anyone on the road alone. We think of the little girl, Jarius' daughter. When Jesus brings her back to life, he looks at her parents and says: give her something to eat! Thus he reassures the girl's father, as if saying to him: Your daughter is returning home, she is returning to her family. It was the same with Lazarus when he came out of the tomb and with the dead boy, whose widowed mother followed behind the coffin: the Lord raised the boy and gave him back to his mother."

"Jesus always returns us home, he never leaves us on the road alone. Jesus is the son of a people; Jesus is the promise made to a people. Jesus' gestures teach us that every healing, every act of forgiveness, always brings us back to our people, that is, to the Church."

To further clarify, Pope Francis drew two additional examples from the Gospel. "Many times, Jesus performed inexplicable gestures ... towards those who had been distanced from the community after having been condemned by their fellow citizens. We find Zacchaeus, who really was a crook and a traitor to his country. And yet Jesus rejoices over him. And we think of Matthew, another traitor to the homeland who gave money to the Romans. Here again, Jesus goes to a feast at his home: a wonderful meal!"

The practical teaching is that "when Jesus forgives he always has us return home. Therefore, one cannot understand Jesus without understanding the people whence he comes, God's chosen people, the people of

Israel. And one cannot understand him without understanding the people he has called to himself: i.e., the Church."

And he added: "Christ and the Church are one. Thus each time Christ calls a person, he leads him to the Church...Jesus' tender gestures enable us to understand that our doctrine, or let's put it this way: **our following of Christ, is not an idea. It is a continual abiding at home. And if it is a possibility, and a reality, for each of us to leave home through a sin or mistake ... salvation comes in returning home: with Jesus in the Church**".

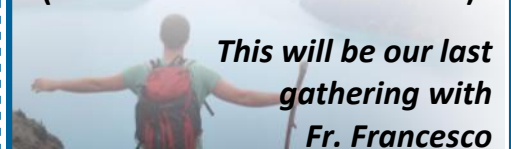

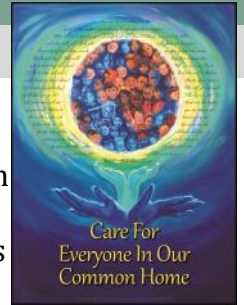
