This Sunday's Mass Readings

1ST READING: Ezekiel 2: 2-5
RESPONSORIAL: Psalm 123: 1-4
2ND READING: 2 Cor 12: 7-10
GOSPEL: Mark 6: 1-6

Excerpts taken [REFLECTION BY FATHER THOMAS ROSICA, CSB](#). Fr. Thomas Rosica is the chief executive officer of the Salt and Light Catholic Media Foundation and Television Network in Canada, is a consultant to the Pontifical Council for Social Communications.

In today's Gospel story, people from Jesus' hometown listened ever so attentively to his teaching because they had heard about the miracles he had performed in other towns...his own people were initially filled with admiration in him and pride because of him. His message of liberation was marvelous. Then they recognized this young prophet as one of their own and they say: *Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary?* (Mark 6:3)

Jesus then startled his own people with a seeming rebuke that no prophet of God can receive honor among his own people. The people of Nazareth took offense at him and refused to listen to what he had to say. They despised his preaching because he was from the working class, a carpenter, a mere layman and they despised him because of his family. Jesus could do no mighty works in their midst because they were closed and disbelieving toward him. If people have come together to hate and to refuse to understand, then they will see no other point of view than their own, and they will refuse to love and accept others.

Today's Gospel shows how difficult it is for us to attain to a universal vision. When we are faced with someone like Jesus, someone with a generous heart, a wide vision and a great spirit, our reactions are very often filled with jealousy, selfishness, and meanness of spirit. His own people couldn't recognize the holiness of Jesus, because they had never really accepted their own. They couldn't honor his relationship with God because they had never fully explored their own sense of belonging to the Lord. They couldn't see the Messiah standing right beside them, because he looked too much like one of them. Until we see ourselves as people beloved of God, miracles will be scarce and the prophets and messengers who rise among us will struggle to be heard and accepted for whom they truly are.

If you are not 'bothered' by this story or think you can't identify with it, it is because you don't think it is about you! But, continue to read on... the people of Jesus' native place were suffering from a particular form of blindness — a blindness that sometimes affects us, too.

Jesus was bitterly criticized because he demonstrated great openness of heart, particularly toward people on the

fringes and borders of society. His openness caused rising opposition that led him to the cross. In the Acts of the Apostles we read more than once that the success of St. Paul's preaching to the gentiles provoked jealousy among some of the Jews, who opposed the Apostle and stirred up persecution against him. Also within the Christian community, we need only recall the situation in Corinth where similar possessive attitudes caused serious harm when many believers attached themselves jealously to one apostle or another; causing conflict and division in the community.

Today's Gospel warns us to be on guard against certain attitudes that are incompatible with the example of Jesus: the human tendency to be possessive, and egoistic and small in mind and heart. We cannot forget that Jesus is the Savior of the world, and not of the village, town, city or nation!

In order to approach and imitate Jesus, who is total beauty and uniqueness, the **quality of magnanimity is necessary in our hearts and minds**. The opposite and enemy of magnanimity is envy. Envy is that fault in the human character that cannot recognize the beauty and uniqueness of the other, and denies the other honor. Envy can no longer see because the eyes are "nailed shut", blinded to one's own beauty and the beauty in others. Envy inevitably leads to destruction, of self and of others. In order to approach and imitate Jesus, who is total beauty and uniqueness, the attitude of envy must be first acknowledged and then banished.

Magnanimity lets others be free, for the other person must become great enough to be an image of God's beauty. Magnanimity arouses the desire in each of us for the other to receive the greatest possible satisfaction and happiness that rightly belongs to the other! Magnanimity is capable of looking beyond itself, it can grant the other what oneself perhaps bitterly lacks, and can perhaps even rejoice in the other's goodness, greatness and beauty.

Let us pray that Jesus not be *amazed at our unbelief* (Mark 6:6), but rather rejoice in our small, daily acts of fidelity to him and our service to our sisters and brothers. **May the Lord grant us magnanimous hearts so that we may look far beyond ourselves and recognize the goodness, greatness and beauty of other people, instead of being jealous of their gifts.** God's power alone can save us from emptiness and poverty of spirit, from confusion and error, and from the fear of death and hopelessness. The gospel of salvation is "great news" for us today.



*Dear brothers and sisters, dear friends,
I struggle to find words to say good
bye to all of you. As you know to be
silent is not my quality. I would like to
say many things but I can't find the
words. This morning I came across a
speech of Pope Francis that made me*

think about my time here at Star of the Sea Parish:

Every man and woman is a mission; that is the reason for our life on this earth. **To be attracted and to be sent** are two movements that our hearts, especially when we are young, feel as interior forces of love; they hold out promise for our future and they give direction to our lives. The fact that we are not in this world by our own choice makes us sense that there is an initiative that precedes us and makes us exist. Each one of us is called to reflect on this fact: **"I am a mission on this Earth;** that is the reason why I am here in this world."
~ Pope Francis

Well, this is how I see the time I spent here with you: a Mission. Not a job, not a duty or something that I have to do because I am a priest. I felt called to a mission of love that I am not capable at all to live by my own strength.

How beautiful would it be to rediscover that our life is a mission! Much greater than our plans, our projects, our little world that we try to build every day!

It was a beautiful mission the time I lived with you, where I experienced many joys and graces. I met many of you, I've shared also in your struggles, in your sufferings.

I would also like to take this opportunity to ask you for forgiveness for the many times I lacked love and charity and I didn't live fully the mission that God entrusted me.

*One thing I can say without a doubt: the Lord has been faithful to me these two years. He loved me with a special love and helped me to stand up from my sins every time. It is true what Jesus Christ says in the Gospel of John: **You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.** (John 15:16)*

*As the Pope was saying, part of the mission is to be sent! And now, God calls me to go to a different Parish. Wherever the Lord wants us to go if we follow Him, there we will be happy! **COURAGE!!!***

POPE FRANCIS: A MAN OF HIS WORD - the new documentary-film about our Holy Father was enjoyed by 132 parishioners and friends in a private showing last Saturday. The papal themes talked about in the film are those that Pope Francis talks about often, including human dignity, the common good, solidarity, the family, work and the dignity of work, the right to life, care for the earth... One of the most striking scenes in the film is one where we see people climbing and sifting through mountains of garbage to find something to sell. Pope Francis wants us to know that the "policies of exclusion of the poor who are then marginalized to live off leftovers" has created a "culture of waste." Each one of us is responsible for this culture of waste, he says. "No one can serve two masters," he reminds us. We need to live in the harmony of creation because we are not called to dominate creation but to be caretakers of it.

One small way we can counter this culture of waste is to have each of us be responsible for bringing our own plate and cutlery to the upcoming Seniors BBQ on July 26th. We will make available disposable plates for those who are not able to bring their own. Bring your own plate/cutlery on July 26th and please also encourage your friends to do so.

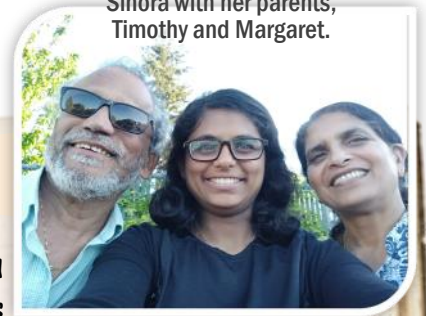

God pursues my heart tirelessly as I journey through life. When I look back, I can see His hand guiding me in so many places. Jesus says, unless you become like a child you cannot enter the Kingdom of God. As a child, God inspired me with the Saints. They modeled for me true Christian life - a life lived with love for God and love for neighbour. My heart was filled with love for the suffering and the lonely. This love which filled me I can now see is God's Grace poured out. I knew that I wanted to spend my life loving the One who created me and loved me so immensely. I also knew I wanted to love the people He loved, who cried out to Him in their suffering. In my childhood innocence, I knew all people should know the love of God and be loved. I was also confident that I could do this and would do this!

As I grew up and began to realize my smallness, I began to despair and wonder what could I, one person, do to make a difference? I couldn't even love my own sister well! We would fight and argue, and with difficulty I would forgive. Here God once again intervened, pouring out His Grace and showing me the way through a beautiful childlike saint - St. Therese of the Child Jesus (the Little Flower). She lived such a simple life; one dedicated to loving God with confidence and loving others in little ways. Best of all, I learned that St. Therese was not perfect! Once again, I was filled with hope and joy! I could live St. Therese's Little Way! I could smile at a stranger, help others with little things, I could forgive (even if it took lots of time) and I could pray. I was confident God heard my prayers and that alone could change the world because God could do anything. He was God after all! The most important thing I learned through St. Therese was that even if I failed at doing all these little things, I would still be loved. My Heavenly Father would love me always. He was waiting to forgive me, pick me up in His arms and console me in my weakness. Saint Therese became my role model for life.

I wish I could say I moved closer towards perfection after this. For me, even the Little Way seemed quite Big and difficult. It is hard to say no to what I want for the sake of others! As a teenager going to Youth Group and being blessed to have a Perpetual Adoration Chapel at our parish was another outpouring of Grace in my life. It was in these places that God began to show me that He yearned to have a personal relationship with me and that He wished to walk with me every moment of my life. I was not alone and He was always there even if I didn't know it. It was in the Adoration Chapel I first felt His presence and peace. I also began to contemplate the depths of His love for me. The more time I spent with Him, the more time I wanted to spend; the more I got to know Him, the more I was willing to say no to what I wanted and yes to what He wanted.

It was also in the Adoration Chapel I began to realize that my heart could be no one else's. I was His totally and He was mine totally. He called me to be His spouse and I said.... not yet! Doubts and questions plagued me: Is that something people really do? Besides, I need to focus on school and getting my teaching degree! But God is persistent and He patiently waits for us. When I finished my studies, I worked in a school with a Dominican Sister (yes, it IS something people really do!) and all my previous excuses didn't work anymore. He was still waiting and He was still calling. I knew, even with all the excuses and the fear of people not understanding my desire and even at times not approving of my desire, that it was what my heart desired more than anything else. When I saw Sisters I felt joy and when I visited Sisters I thought: I don't think I have met other people with more joy and fulfillment! Their lives didn't seem perfect or easy, but FULFILLED and JOYFUL. The longer I waited, the more restless I felt. I didn't want to say no to religious life and yet I didn't want to say yes to any other life either... all the while, God was continually pouring out His Grace upon me and loving me. I finally said YES to Him. Yes, I would try it out and see what this life is really like. Unsurprisingly, it is not easy or perfect, but my heart has never felt more at peace or fulfilled or joyful! Is God calling me to be His spouse? I think so! What I know for certain is that He is walking with me through it all and that is the only way I would have it.
