CARMELITE NUNS OF COMPIEGNE

Sixteen Carmelites caught up in the French Revolution and martyred. When the French Revolution started in 1789, a group of twenty-one discalced Carmelites lived in a monastery in Compiègne, France, founded in 1641. The monastery was ordered closed in 1790 by the Revolutionary government, and the nuns were disbanded. Sixteen of the nuns were accused of living in a religious community in 1794. They were arrested on June 22 and imprisoned in a Visitation convent in Compiègne. There they openly resumed their religious life. On July 12, 1794, the Carmelites were taken to Paris and five days later were sentenced to death. They went to the guillotine singing the *Salve Regina*. They were beatified in 1906 by Pope St. Pius X. The Carmelites were: Marie Claude Brard; Madeleine Brideau, the sub-prior; Maire Croissy, grandniece of Colbert Marie Dufour; Marie Hanisset; Marie Meunier, a novice; Rose de Neufville Annette Pebras; Anne Piedcourt; Madeleine Lidoine, the prioress; Angélique Roussel; Catherine Soiron and Therese Soiron, both extern sisters, natives of Compiègne and blood sisters; Anne Mary Thouret; Marie Trezelle; and Elisabeth Verolot. The martyrdom of the nuns was immortalised by the composer François Poulenc in his famous opera *Dialogues des Carmélites*.

THE PRICE OF OUR FAITH: DO YOU KNOW HOW THE APOSTLES WERE MARTYRED?

It is too easy to take our Faith for granted. We can complain at the slightest requirement. Perhaps the Mass is 'too long'.

Perhaps the air conditioning or PA system is less than ideal. Perhaps the Church's moral teaching seems too demanding or 'out of touch' with modern thinking. Perhaps some aspect of the Liturgy seems 'boring'. And so forth. But have you recalled that the martyrs died so you could have this Faith? Every one of the Apostles except St John the Evangelist died a martyr's death for our capacity to know that Jesus is Lord and that he died and rose for us.

1. St James the Great (Son of Zebedee) was beheaded.
2. St Andrew was crucified on an X-shaped cross after being scourged. He preached to his tormentors to his last breath.
3. St Bartholomew had his skin flayed off.
4. St James the Less was cast off the Southeast pinnacle of the Temple. When the 100-foot drop did not fully kill him, he was beat to death with clubs.
5. St Jude was shot through with arrows.
6. St Simon was crucified.
7. St Matthew was killed with a sword.
8. St Philip was beheaded.
9. St Peter was crucified upside down.
10. St Thomas was stabbed to death with a spear.
11. St Matthias was stoned and then beheaded.
12. St John the Evangelist was thrown into a vat of boiling oil and when he miraculously survived he was sent to prison on the Isle of Patmos where he died years later.
13. St Paul was beheaded.
14. St Mark was dragged to death by horses.
15. St Luke was hanged to death.

What will you suffer for handing on the Faith? The martyrs went to death to proclaim Christ Jesus, but some of us cannot bear if someone merely raises an eyebrow at us or scoffs at us. Merely being less popular or excluded from the world's admiration is too high a price for many. The next time you say the Creed at Mass remember that those words are written with blood. The next time your kids protest going to church or your teenager scorns the Faith, you insist they practice the Catholic Faith. Remember that others have faced far more formidable foes than an unhappy child. The next time you are challenged for your Faith and merely have to risk ridicule, remember others suffered (and still do suffer) prison. Many were (and still are) killed for it. Remember the Martyrs and stay faithful, dedicated and courageous. Stand firm in the Faith and never give up.

FROM THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

675 Before Christ's second coming the Church must pass through a final trial that will shake the faith of many believers. The persecution that accompanies her pilgrimage on earth will unveil the 'mystery of iniquity' in the form of a religious deception offering men an apparent solution to their problems at the price of apostasy from the truth. The supreme religious deception is that of the Antichrist, a pseudo-messianism by which man glorifies himself in place of God and of his Messiah come in the flesh.

676 The Antichrist's deception already begins to take shape in the world every time the claim is made to realize within history that messianic hope which can only be realized beyond history through the eschatological judgment. The Church has rejected even modified forms of this falsification of the kingdom to come under the name of millenarianism, especially the 'intrinsically perverse' political form of a secular messianism.

677 The Church will enter the glory of the kingdom only through this final Passover, when she will follow her Lord in his death and Resurrection. The kingdom will be fulfilled, then, not by a historic triumph of the Church through a progressive ascendancy, but only by God's victory over the final unleashing of evil, which will cause his Bride to come down from heaven. God's triumph over the revolt of evil will take the form of the Last Judgment after the final cosmic upheaval of this passing world.

678 Following in the steps of the prophets and John the Baptist, Jesus announced the judgment of the Last Day in his preaching. Then will the conduct of each one and the secrets of hearts be brought to light. Then will the culpable unbelief that counted the offer of God's grace as nothing be condemned. Our attitude to our neighbour will disclose acceptance or refusal of grace and divine love. On the Last Day Jesus will say: 'Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.'

679 Christ is Lord of eternal life. Full right to pass definitive judgment on the works and hearts of men belongs to him as redeemer of the world. He 'acquired' this right by his cross. The Father has given 'all judgment to the Son'. Yet the Son did not come to judge, but to save and to give the life he has in himself. By rejecting grace in this life, one already judges oneself, receives according to one's works, and can even condemn oneself for all eternity by rejecting the Spirit of Love.

1. What is the plan of God for man?

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. In the fullness of time, God the Father sent his Son as the Redeemer and Savior of mankind, fallen into sin, thus calling all into his Church and, through the work of the Holy Spirit, making them adopted children and heirs of his eternal happiness.

2. Why does man have a desire for God?

God himself, in creating man in his own image, has written upon his heart the desire to see him. Even if this desire is often ignored, God never ceases to draw man to himself because only in God will he find and live the fullness of truth and happiness for which he never stops searching. By nature and by vocation, therefore, man is a religious being, capable of entering into communion with God. This intimate and vital bond with God confers on man his fundamental dignity.
