Last weekend we received the news that Fr. Fagan passed away peacefully at Rosemary Heights Senior Citizen Residence where he had lived for many years. Fr. Jim was in his 99th year and had been retired from priestly ministry since 1998, having been pastor of Star of the Sea Parish as his last assignment. Under his leadership the property at 24th avenue and 150 street was obtained, Good Shepherd church was built and Star of the Sea school was relocated to this site with the building of the new school facility. Gospel reflection from olgseattle.org

In today's Gospel passages the disciples, James and John, seek privileged positions of honor – this request follows immediately after Jesus' third prediction of His pending Passion, Death and Resurrection in Jerusalem. From this account, there are several significant lessons we can gain for our lives of faith.

First of all, we see how the Passion of Jesus continues when members of the Church give in to similar competitive ambitious pursuits of exclusive and privileged positions. This is a warning to the Church reminding us that those who pursue such ambitions can cause the Body of Christ (the Church) to suffer. While Pope Francis and his predecessors have spoken strongly against such manifestations of ambition, like careerism, clericalism, and other "diseases" that afflict the Body of Christ, we need to remember that the **inordinate thirst for prestige and honor through positions of ministry can afflict the Church at all levels from the volunteers who coordinate coffee and donuts to the members of ministry teams and advisory councils.** No one is immune from this temptation whether they be parishioners, deacons, priests, bishops, or even the Pope himself! When anyone seeks a position of ministry or leadership because of how it honors or benefits them personally then destructive ambition has entered their soul and the Body of Christ always suffers.

It is also significant that James and John approach Jesus twice in their request. First, they ask the Lord to do whatever they ask (v.35) and then they ask for selfish pursuits (v.37). **Faith is always distorted when we try to convince God to do what we want rather than seeking God's will for our lives so we can do what the Lord wants.** At this point in Mark's Gospel, Jesus has drawn close to Jerusalem, and His journey is almost fulfilled. We see in the question of James and John that the disciples have much to learn before their journey of discipleship is completed. They still have not yet learned the proper relationship of faith and disposition of servanthood that will allow them to bear the Cross with Jesus. We can be tempted in our faith to approach God in the same way that James and John approached Jesus. **Authentic growth in discipleship is marked by increased surrender to God and not the desire for increased control over God.**

The remedy Jesus offers for ambition is that of faithful suffering. He asks James and John if they can drink the cup He drinks and can be Baptized in the Baptism He will experience. **That is the ultimate question of discipleship: Greatness is not based on where you sit but on how closely you can remain to the Lord when it involves suffering and persecution.** To drink from the cup of Jesus

is to share in our Lord's very suffering on Calvary rendered present to us in the Eucharist.

Jesus is asking James and John, and you and I, the fundamental question of discipleship: ***Can you follow the Lord in His suffering and not just in His glory?***

The other ten disciples "began to feel indignant with James and John" (v.41). We can easily understand the very human reaction of the other ten towards the sons of Zebedee. The two had just attempted to secure honor to the exclusion of the rest and their request was rejected. In a certain sense, James and John may have been humbled by Jesus but the other ten were seeking to humiliate them. *Are we not so often frivolously fascinated by the shortcomings and failures of*

others? Unhealthy and uncharitable fascination with another's failure continues our Lord's suffering in the Body of Christ just as much as the inordinate ambition of James and John. As a Church, we need to remember that Jesus desires our unity and charity towards others, especially in moments of personal weakness and failure rather than division and humiliation.

Jesus then addresses the damaging response of the ten disciples by contrasting how greatness and authority are expressed in the secular world with how they are expressed in the Kingdom of God. The Romans governed by brutal force and relied upon intimidation for absolute submission and loyalty. **Jesus used His authority in service to others rather than in domination of them.** Jesus then sends the disciples on mission, and we are told that He shared His own authority with them so that they could continue His works of healing, liberation, and service to the truth. **By exercising their authority in the right way (selfless, sacrificial service to others in imitation of Jesus), the disciples will be able to avoid temptations to that false worldly greatness that divides and weakens the Body of Christ.** Not only are they to be servants to one another but Jesus also tells them that they must become slaves to all. That is a very powerful term; a reminder that **all people** - not just some people-have a right to receive the Gospel. **The disciples and the Church cannot rest until the whole world has effectively received the Gospel of Jesus.** This is not so much a task we complete as it is a life-long mission we fulfill.

The *cup* is an Old Testament image for God's judgment. The wicked would be made to drink this cup in punishment for their sins (see Psalm 75:9; Jeremiah 25:15, 28; Isaiah 51:17). But Jesus has come to drink this cup on behalf of all humanity. He has come to be baptized—which means plunged or immersed—into the sufferings we all deserve for our sins. In this He will fulfill the task of Isaiah's suffering servant, whom we read about in today's First Reading.

Letter received from Fr. Gosbert - 19/10/2018



Dear Star of the Sea,

My journey back to Tanzania was long - I first flew to Calgary, then Amsterdam and finally Dar es Salaam - but it allowed me a lot of time to reflect on all my experiences in Canada especially on the many moments I had at Star of the Sea parish. I promised that I would write as soon as I could, but I have been silent for a while, because I spent 5 days in Dar es Salaam (our capital city) before coming to Iringa and to Madege Parish.

Our Vicar General had asked me to stay in Dar es Salaam to care for a fellow priest from our Diocese who has been admitted at our national hospital. By God's grace, his treatments are going well and his health is now encouraging, so I was allowed to finally return to my parish on Thursday (Oct 18). My bishop was very happy to see me back, and is grateful for what this Mission Appeal trip has done for our parish. He wishes all the blessings of God be upon you.

My parishioners are also very happy that I am back. Much more, those from Ilutila village where the dispensary will be built, are very happy after hearing this 'good news' concerning the future availability of health services. This will make such an enormous impact on the lives of the people.

Upon my arrival home, we had a gathering here at the parish with the priests, nuns, some catechists and the representatives of lay people from all the 14 outstations. I had a lot of things to share about my journey, and the way I was welcomed by you. They were all happy to hear my stories, but I know they cannot understand some of the things of a 'different world'. I have been like a one-eyed-person among the blind.

Fr. Steven, my assistant in the parish, is also very happy that I am back. I found out that Sunday he was in a terrible car accident. Our parish car brakes failed, and he lost control as they were travelling to one of the outstations. They were 6 in the car, and we praise God, they come out safely but with some injuries. The car is still there after being pulled from the ditch waiting for the mechanic to come see if can start. A nun who was in the car says they are alive because "it was not the day that God has written for us".

I thank you once more for the generosity you have shown to me. I thank our pastors, Fr.Dion, Fr. Francis and Fr. Ajin. I thank the staff team of Star of the Sea parish, and all of you who have shown me such kindness.

May God bless you.
We will be remembering you always in our prayers.
