

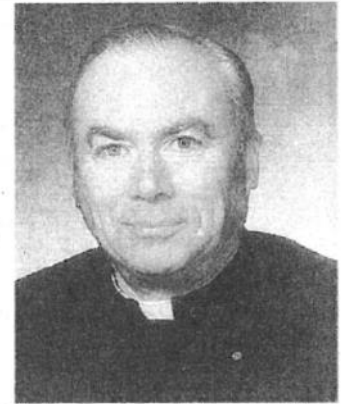
Pastor's Corner

FAGAN, Reverend James Edmund
1919 - 2018

Passed away peacefully in White Rock, B.C. on October 13, 2018 at the age of 99. Rev. James Fagan will be lovingly remembered by brother John Fagan (Carol) and sisters Clare Woodruff and Bernice Hughes, sister-in-law Anne Fagan and many cousins, nieces and nephews. Father Jim was born in Vancouver, B.C., the eldest of 12 children. Baptized in St. Augustine's Church, he attended school at St. Patrick's and Vancouver College. After Grade 10, Fr. Jim decided to leave school to help his father, James, who was a mining engineer and promoter. He went to work at the gold mine in Shoal Bay, near Campbell River on Vancouver Island, where he stayed for five years, becoming a journeyman miner. After completing high school in 1942 and philosophy at the Seminary of Christ the King in 1946, Fr. Jim was sent to St. Joseph's Seminary in Edmonton to finish his theology. Fr. Jim was ordained March 25, 1950 by Archbishop William Duke at Holy Rosary Cathedral in Vancouver. Over his 46 years of service as a priest in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Vancouver, Jim's pastorates included St. Margaret's Parish (Ocean Falls) from 1951-1963; St. Mary's (Chilliwack) from 1963-69; St. Helen's (Burnaby) from 1969-73; and St. Edmund's in North Vancouver, 1973-78. Fr. Jim had a special affection for his period of service in Ocean Falls - St. Margaret's parish that included the communities of Bella Bella, Bella Coola and Alert Bay - which he served by boat. -With over 3,200 km of coastline, the ports of call within the parish included logging camps, First Nations, and lighthouse keepers. In 1978, Father Fagan moved to Star of the Sea Parish in White Rock, where he served until his retirement in 1997. He founded Star of the Sea Elementary School and was the driving force for construction of Good Shepherd Church which opened in 1994. Fr. Jim spent much of his retirement with dear friends and family in White Rock and Mission Viejo, California. Fr. Jim was an avid golfer and competed in numerous tournaments on the Canadian Seniors Gold Tour. He was also an enthusiastic advocate for growth of the game among youth in the lower mainland. The Prayer Vigil will be held Sunday, October 28, at 4 p.m. at Good Shepherd Church, 2250 150 Street, South Surrey. The Funeral Mass will be celebrated at Good Shepherd Church on Monday, October 29, at 1 p.m. with Archbishop Michael Miller officiating.

This Sunday's Mass Readings

Showroom Christians - those who only practice their faith externally with no transformation in their hearts in push away people seeking Jesus. And this is a temptation! I invite each person to examine your conscience - are you someone able to hear the people's cry for help and to support them on their journey to get close to the Lord?

In today's Gospel reading (Mark 10:46-52), Jesus and his disciples were leaving Jericho and we are told a large crowd followed Him - because He spoke like a master, with real authority. Bartimaeus, a blind man, heard the noise and asked, 'What's happening?' It was Jesus the people tell him. Thus, Bartimaeus began to cry out and, in an act of faith, he cried out loudly: **'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!'**. His words were truly an act of faith!

But among the people who were there with Jesus, each one had his own personality, his own way of seeing life, of feeling life. First of all, there is a group of people who didn't hear the cry of the blind man. It is that group of people who, even today, don't hear the cry of the many who are in need of Jesus. In short, it is a group of people who are indifferent: they don't hear, they believe that life is their own little group; they are happy, they are deaf to the clamour of so many people in need of salvation, in need of Jesus' help, in need of the Church! However, these are selfish people, they live for themselves, unable to hear the voice of Jesus.

Then there are those who hear this cry that pleads for help, but they want to silence it. In fact, in the Gospel, Mark indicates that many people rebuked Bartimaeus to silence him, telling him not to cry out and to leave the master in peace. Indeed, even the disciples do so - recall how the disciples wanted to keep the children away as well, so they don't disturb the master. Thus, the disciples also tried to silence Bartimaeus, thinking that the master was their own - He was for them, not for everyone! In so doing, the disciples keep those who cry out and are in need of faith and salvation separate from Jesus!

Then there is another group, composed of the businessmen: they were religious, it seems, but Jesus

cast them out of the temple because they were doing business there, in the house of God. These are people who don't hear and don't want to hear the cry for help, but prefer to conduct their business and use the People of God, use the Church, to conduct their business. Even these businessmen distance the people from Jesus and do not allow the people to ask for help.

Another group who push away the people from Jesus are those who are **Christians in name only** - without witness, who do not bear the witness of Christians. Yes, they are Christians in name, showroom Christians, reception Christians, but their inner life is not Christian, it's worldly. And one who calls himself a Christian but lives as a socialite distances those who cry 'help' to Jesus.

Finally, there are the rigorists - those whom Jesus rebukes because they lay such heavy burdens on the people's shoulders. And to them Jesus dedicates all of Chapter 23 of St Matthew. He says to them: "hypocrites, you exploit the people!" In fact, instead of responding to the cry for salvation, they push the people away.

The 'first group' is comprised of those who do not hear. The second, however, includes many different, diverse people who hear the call, but separate the people from Jesus. And there is also a third group and they are those who help the people to approach Jesus and who say to Bartimaeus: *"Be brave, get up, he's calling you!"*. This is the group of Christians who are consistent between what they believe and what they live. It is the group of Christians who help the people who cry out, asking for salvation, asking for grace, asking for spiritual health for their soul, helping them to get close to Jesus.

In light of this, my dear friends, I propose an examination of conscience that will do you and I good. In which group am I? In the first, with those who don't hear the many cries asking for the help of salvation? Am I concerned with only my relationship with Jesus, closed, selfish? Or do I belong to the second group, with those who separate people from Jesus, whether by lacking coherence in life, lacking testimony, whether by being too attached to money, or through rigidity? Do I distance people from Jesus? Or do I belong to the third group, with those who hear the cry of so many people and help them to approach Jesus? These are questions that each of us can answer in our heart.
