THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The first reading of Mass is an invitation to joy. The Prophet Zephaniah at the end of the seventh century B.C. spoke to the city of Jerusalem and its people with these words: "Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exalt with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem...! The Lord your God is in your midst" As in the times of the Prophet Zephaniah, it is particularly to those being tested and to "life's wounded and orphans of joy" that God's Word is being addressed in a special way. To transform the world, God chose a humble young girl from a village in Galilee, Mary of Nazareth, and challenged her with this greeting: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you". In these words lies the secret of an authentic Christmas. God repeats them to the Church, to each one of us: Rejoice, the Lord is close!

According to **Pope Saint Leo the Great, Doctor of the Church**, who reigned from the 29th of September 440 to the 10th of November 461, the celebration of the Ember Days is of Apostolic Origin, that is, established by the Apostles themselves. They consist of four sets of three days each. They were established for three main reasons : i) In thanksgiving to God for the blessings that accrue to the Faithful through the gifts of nature; ii) To thank God for the blessing of the Priesthood (that is, the Sacrament of Holy Orders), to pray for those newly ordained and for an increase in vocations to the Priesthood and religious life; and iii) To do penance, primarily through the Sacrament of Penance itself, and to do other penances by way of fast and abstinence. Remember the injunction of Our Lord : 'Unless ye do penance, ye shall all likewise perish.' Perhaps when you look at your Advent observance you find that you have done little or nothing by way of preparation for Our Lord's birthday on 25 December and His Coming at the end of the world. Therefore why not do something special on the three Ember Days? : Thank God for the gifts of nature, beseech God for an increase of vocations through prayers of your own choosing and get to Confession and do other penances.

IN NEW BOOK ON CLERGY AND RELIGIOUS LIFE, POPE FRANCIS ADDRESSES HOMOSEXUALITY

In a book-length interview, the Pope said 'ministry or consecrated life' is not the place for people with ingrained homosexual tendencies

In a book-length interview to be published next week, Pope Francis addressed gifts and challenges for clerical and religious vocations, among them the challenge of homosexuality in the clergy.

"The issue of homosexuality is a very serious issue that must be adequately discerned from the beginning with the candidates, if that is the case. We have to be exacting. In our societies it even seems that homosexuality is fashionable and that mentality, in some way, also influences the life of the Church", the Pope says in the book "The Strength of a Vocation", set to be released Dec. 3 in ten languages.

In an excerpt from the book, released Friday by Religión Digital, the pope said he is concerned about the issue of evaluating and forming people with homosexual tendencies in the clergy and consecrated life.

"This is something I am concerned about, because perhaps at one time it did not receive much attention", he said.

Francis said that with candidates for the priesthood or religious life "we have to take great care during formation in human and affective maturity. We have to seriously discern, and listen to the voice of experience that the Church also has. When care is not taken in discerning all of this, problems increase. As I said before, it can happen that at the time perhaps they didn't exhibit [that tendency], but later on it comes out."

"The issue of homosexuality is a very serious issue that must be adequately discerned from the beginning with the candidates, if that is the case", the pope reiterated.

Francis recalled that one time "I had a somewhat scandalized bishop here who told me that he had found out that in his diocese, a very large diocese, there were several homosexual priests and that he had to deal with all that, intervening, above all, in the formation process, to form a different group of clergy."

"It's a reality we can't deny. There is no lack of cases in the consecrated life either. A religious told me that, on a canonical visit to one of the provinces in his congregation, he was surprised. He saw that there were good young students and even some already professed religious who were gay", he related.

The pope said that the religious "wondered if it were an issue and asked me if there was something wrong with that. Francis said he was told by one religious superior that the issue was not "that serious, it's just an expression of an affection."

"That's a mistake", Francis warned. "It's not just an expression of an affection. In consecrated and priestly life, there's no room for that kind of affection. Therefore, the Church recommends that people with that kind of ingrained tendency should not be accepted into the ministry or consecrated life. The ministry or the consecrated life is not his place."

We "have to urge homosexual priests, and men and women religious to live celibacy with integrity, and above all, that they be impeccably responsible, trying to never scandalise either their communities or the faithful holy people of God by living a double life. It's better for them to leave the ministry or the consecrated life rather than to live a double life."

The pope was asked in the book if there are limits to what can be tolerated in formation.

"Of course. When there are candidates with neurosis, marked imbalances, difficult to channel not even with therapeutic help, they shouldn't be accepted to either the priesthood or the religious life, They should be helped to take another direction, but they should not be abandoned. They should be guided, but they should not be admitted.

POPE DECRIES DENYING UNBORN CHILDREN ‘THE RIGHT TO COME INTO THE WORLD’

In commemoration of the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), Pope Francis condemned the ongoing violations of many rights, and first among them, that unborn babies are denied the right to life through abortion.

“When fundamental rights are violated”, the Pope told participants in an international conference celebrating the UDHR, “or when they are favoured by some to the detriment of others, or when they are guaranteed only to certain groups, then serious injustices occur, which in turn fuel conflicts with heavy consequences both within individual nations and in relations among them.”

“Among other things, I am thinking of the unborn children who are denied the right to come into the world”, Francis said.

The Universal Declaration, which was proclaimed by the U.N. National Assembly on December 10, 1948, explicitly states in article 3: “Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.”

In his message Monday, the Pope appealed to world leaders as well as all men and women of good will to fight for the rights of their brothers and sisters, especially those who have no voice of their own.

Everyone is called to contribute courageously to respect for “the fundamental rights of every person, especially those who are ‘invisible,’ the many who are hungry and thirsty, who are naked, sick, foreign or detained, who live on the margins of society or are discarded”, he said.

“The Gospel itself invites us to turn our gaze to the least of our brothers and sisters, to move to compassion and to concretely commit ourselves to alleviate their suffering”, he said.

Among other violations of human rights, the Pope mentioned exclusion from proper education, unjust deprivation from work or slave labour, detainment in inhuman conditions, torture, and forced disappearances.

Francis has often denounced the evil of abortion, calling it a “horrendous crime.”

In October, the Pope compared going for an abortion to “hiring a hit man” to take out your child.

In a series of off-the-cuff reflections, the Pope said abortion was like “bumping someone off” when they get in our way.

Often the killing of human life in the womb is defended “in the name of safeguarding other rights”, the Pope said. “But how can an act that suppresses innocent and helpless life in its beginnings be therapeutic, civil, or even human?”

“I ask you”, the Pope continued, “is it right to ‘bump off’ a human life to solve a problem? Is it right to hire a hitman to solve a problem? You cannot, it is not right to ‘bump off’ a human being, no matter how small, to solve a problem. It is like hiring a hitman to solve a problem”, he repeated.
