Dear Parishioners,

On this third Sunday of Advent we wear the rose vestments as a sign of the joy of the season and our closeness to the feast of Christmas. And in this spirit of joy we highlight the theme of "**Respect**" with a focus on various ministries that portray a commitment to the good of others who may especially deserve the outreach and attention of the people in the parish. So we have the **Hospitality ministry** that involves the welcoming of those coming into Mass; the **Prison Ministry** that involves visiting those who cannot come to Mass; the **St. Martin's Guild** that helps people in special circumstances of need; and the **Seniors Outreach** group that involves serving the senior members of the parish.

These are all really worthwhile ways of interacting with others and providing a tangible sign of the care and kindness for those involved and for those they reach out to. There's always room for more helpers in these various ways of demonstrating the grace of Respect.

Please take notice of the Mass times for the feast of Christmas, and plan to come a little earlier than you might normally. There are always larger numbers coming to Mass and the parking takes longer and the weather may be an issue, so planning ahead is a good thing.

This Sunday's Mass Readings

1ST READING: Zephaniah 3: 14-18

RESPONSORIAL: Isaiah 12:2-6

The following reflection is taken from the Biblical Reflection for the Third Sunday of Advent C - Dec 16, 2012 by Fr. Thomas Rosica, CSB saltandlighttv.org and from Dr. Scott Hahn, St. Paul Centre stpaulcenter.com

On this third Sunday of Advent -- known as Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of rejoicing -- this theme resounds through today's readings: **"Rejoice! . . . The Lord is near!"**

St. Paul tells us in today's epistle to **Rejoice in the Lord always** (Phil 4:4). This rejoicing to which St. Paul invites us, forms the heart of the Advent season. But we must ask ourselves, when St. Paul wrote this letter to the persecuted Christians, what did they have to rejoice about? **The answer is their relationship with the Lord**, which can even become stronger and more intimate in times of persecution. Their joy is not in their circumstance; indeed it is often in spite of their circumstance. Rather it is in the Lord.

Sheer joy arises out of a deep and abiding relationship with God that carries the believer through all sorts of trials and tribulations. Rejoicing in the Lord is a sort of adoration, and adoration often takes the form of prayer. Rejoicing constantly leads to praying and praising repeatedly. Since Paul refers to giving thanks after he mentions prayer, it is probable that the term "praying" refers to petitioning God in some form, perhaps interceding for self and others in some manner.

The opposite of rejoicing and happiness is not sorrow, but rather a deadness that often manifests itself through cynicism, meanness of spirit and smallness of mind and heart. Many of us know what that feels like: the deadness and dissatisfaction induced by a consumer culture that stimulates our senses and bombards us with largely meaningless choices, while leaving us starved for some deeper purpose.

The gospel ready today continues last week's focus on John the Baptist and his role in preparing the way for Christ. The people are "filled with expectation" as they believe John the Baptist might be the Messiah they've been waiting for. Three times we hear their question: *"What then should we do?"*

The Messiah's coming requires every man and woman to choose—to **"repent"** or not. That's John's message and it will be Jesus' too. **"Repentance"** translates an ancient Greek word, metanoia (μετάνοια), which literally means "change of mind". In the Scriptures, repentance is presented as a two-fold turning away from sin and toward God. This "turning" is more than attitude adjustment. It means a radical life change, and John challenged the crowds who came to him, calling upon them to **show evidence of their repentance**: *"Therefore bear fruits in keeping with repentance..."* (Luke 3:8)

John tells his listeners that they cannot rely on their lineage as Israelites.



Repentance, rather, must be observable in one's actions. Here, Luke is continuing to set up two important themes of his Gospel message: **the Christian faith is expressed in one's actions, and the call to salvation is extended to everyone, Jews and Gentiles.**

The crowds ask John the Baptist for specifics, i.e. what evidence of repentance is required? John replies by naming concrete actions: crowds should share their food and cloaks; tax collectors should be just; soldiers should act fairly.

When the crowd begins to wonder if John the Baptist might be the Messiah, John interprets his baptism and makes it clear that his ministry is in preparation for the Messiah. John the Baptist knows his place and role in God's plan of salvation. By encouraging the crowd to act similarly in accordance with their stations in life, John teaches us that **each person has a role to play in God's salvation**. It is the great mystery of our salvation that God permits and even asks for human cooperation in his divine plans!

Each of us is being called today to stand in that crowd and hear the good news of John's call to repentance. Let us examine our lives, asking from our hearts as they did: "What should we do?" **Our repentance should spring not from our fear of coming wrath, but from a joyful sense of the nearness of our saving God.**

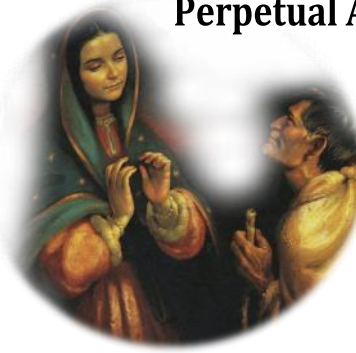

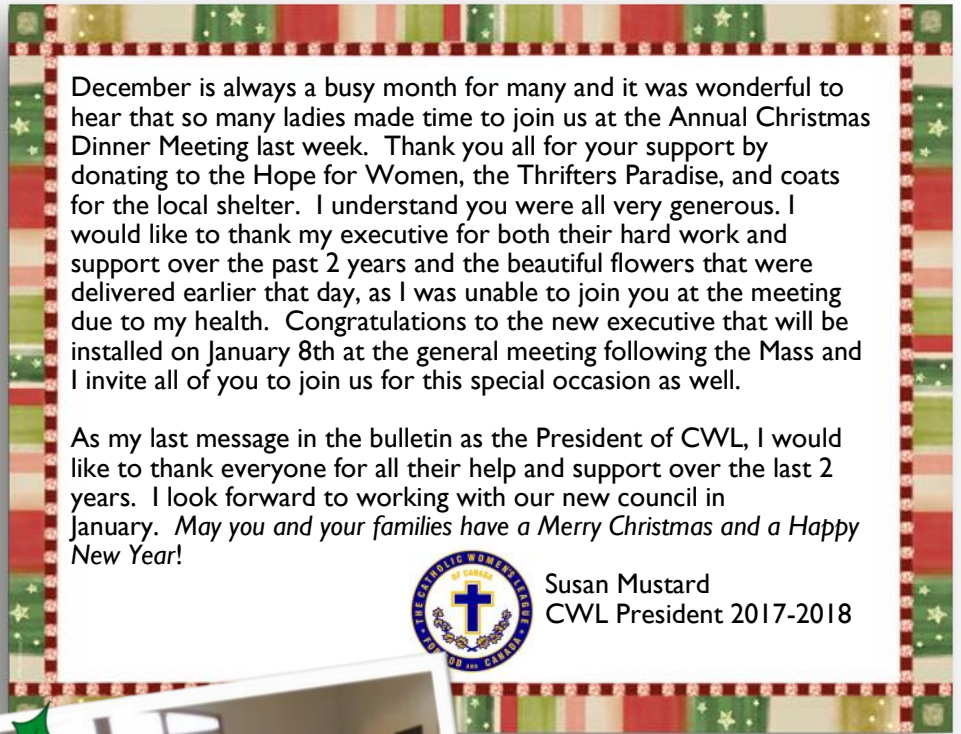

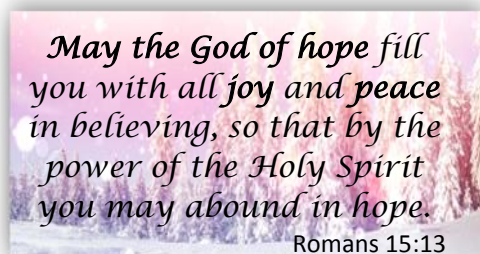
