Archbishop Miller's Christmas Message

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

...Christmas celebrations enable us to remember that God has not forgotten us and that he comes to us in our daily lives. He came among us 2,000 years ago, born in Bethlehem. But he also comes to be with us today in every situation of our life, the good times and the bad. He dwells among us; he lives with us and within us.

As we journey toward Christmas, the Church takes us by the hand and helps us to experience once again the joyful expectation of the Lord’s coming to his people long ago, and to us today.

As we approach Christmas during this season of hope, I urge everyone to invite Mary to be your companion on the journey. At the Annunciation, when she affirmed, “*Let it be done unto me according to your word*” (Lk 1:38), she was saying: “I don’t know what this all means, but I trust that good things will happen because the Lord promises this.”

Mary believed, and she invites us to believe and trust in God’s goodness and faithfulness. She gave up control over her own future and let God define her life. She was willing to let him set the agenda, for she trusted that he leads us according to his love, casting out our fear. Mary hoped in God and she leads us to hope...

RCIA Update

A big part of the Church's mission is to help people respond when God calls them. For Christians, initiation and on-going participation in the life of the Church are the primary responses to God's call.

Being Accepted

Becoming Catholic is a process. The first part of this process is called "Evangelization and Precatechumenate". Since the beginning of November and after 8 weeks of Alpha, a group of adults have continued to meet every Wednesday evening in Good Shepherd Church to explore and learn more about our Catholic faith.

Through the grace of God, this group of **Inquirers** will be ready to commit to becoming Catholic and will be invited to celebrate the "Rite of Acceptance into the Order of the Catechumenate", **scheduled for Sunday, January 13, 2019 at the 11AM Mass.** By celebrating this rite, the person is officially and publicly declaring his or her intention to enter into a formal relationship with the Church, learning its ways and participating in its lifestyle. The Church, in turn, accepts their commitment and pledges its support throughout the person's journey of faith.

It is important that the parish as a whole serve as a guide to the **Inquirers** because the parish is our best example of the way of faith and conversion. As parishioners, we are all asked to be a shining, clear example of a people of faith and a community of conversion. While this all sounds lovely and easy to grasp, in reality (and if we are honest with ourselves), it can be very difficult to pull off! Because people are fallible; we are often unfaithful; we often resist change, and we witness those failings in our fellow parishioners! That is why sometimes, without really even thinking about it, RCIA **Inquirers** are shielded from the larger parish community, instead favouring a "RCIA community." But in reality, there is

no RCIA community. **Inquirers** are not joining the RCIA. They are joining Christ. And the place they find Christ is within the Body of Christ—the body of believers that we call "parish." That is the only community that can initiate the **Inquirers** into the way of faith and conversion.

"Hence, the entire community must help the candidates and the catechumens throughout the process of initiation..." (RCIA 9).

The Parishioner's (YOUR) Role

#1 is PRAY. Pray for each of our **Inquirers** who God has called by planting something in their hearts to move them to seek some kind of relationship with the Church. You may not know each of them personally, but God does!

BE A SPONSOR. The Rite of Acceptance makes the **Inquirers** members of the Church as those preparing to be baptized. Therefore the person is given a title and role to play in the Church - that of "catechumen" which means "one in whom the Word of God echoes". In preparation for this rite, the Church gives the inquiring person a gift - one of its own baptized members to be a **sponsor** or companion through the next part of the process of becoming Catholic.

The primary job of a sponsor is to be a spiritual friend to the catechumen (or baptized candidate). A sponsor needs to be able to share his or her own faith and needs to be a person of prayer. A sponsor is not a catechist and isn't expected to know more about church teaching than the average adult Catholic. The catechumen (or baptized candidate) will raise many questions the sponsor will not be able to immediately answer. That's normal. The sponsor needs to know who to call on to find the answers.

Do you feel the Holy Spirit moving your heart to answer this call to accompany a brother or sister in Christ in their journey of faith?

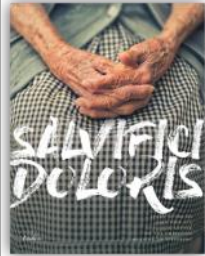
